What is PHH?

Project Helping Hand (PHH) helps keep the lights on for members in need. PHH is a voluntary member contribution program, which provides limited funding – payable through community agencies throughout the co-op’s service territory – to those who need help paying their electric bills, i.e., senior citizens, military veterans, the disabled or members struggling to make ends meet.

To receive help from Adams Electric’s PHH program, call 1-800-726-2324 during regular business hours. You will be directed to the agency nearest your service location that administers these funds for the co-op.

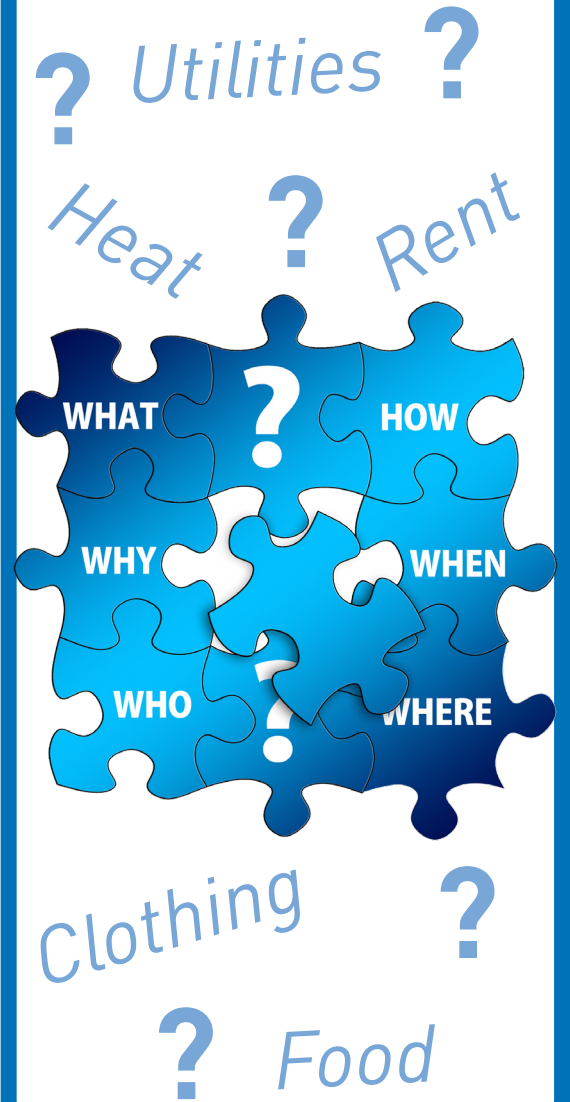

Not sure where to turn in an emergency or disaster? Having a crisis? Can't afford food, utilities, rent or healthcare? A case-worker with 211 may be able to help.
